How to complete this form

1. Shipper/Consignor Information
 - a. You are the shipper or consignor if you are transporting the dangerous good(s) on our vessels.
 - b. You are required to provide your name, address, contact information and a 24-hour phone number that must be available without interruption while dangerous goods are in transit.
 - c. If transporting goods that require an ERAP, you must provide the ERAP reference number issued by Transport Canada and the ERAP telephone number. If the ERAP telephone number and 24-hour number are the same, the 24-hour number can be shown.
2. Description of Dangerous Good(s)
 - a. UN Number. This is a four-digit number that is recognized internationally to identify a dangerous good and can be found in Schedule 1 and Schedule 2 of the *Transportation of Dangerous Goods Regulations*.
 - b. Shipping Name. This is the proper name that identifies the good.
 - c. Class. Dangerous goods fall under a numerical primary class.
 - d. Sub. Class / Compat. Grp. Some goods also have a subsidiary class or a compatibility group.
 - e. Packing Group. If a dangerous good has a packing group, it must be written here in roman numerals.
 - f. Flash Point. Required for dangerous goods in Class 3, Flammable Liquids.
 - g. Marine Pollutant. Dangerous goods that are classified as marine pollutants must be identified in this document.
 - h. Quantity. The quantity of dangerous goods must be provided in metric form; solids are normally measured in kilograms and liquids in litres.
 - i. Number of packages. Dangerous goods that come in one or more small means of containment should be counted here.
